

Plants in the Classroom

Label Pot with your child's name before bringing it to school.

Please label your child's plant with its name (type of plant, i.e. bamboo, spider plant).

Make sure your child can handle and carry their plant safely.

Make sure that the dirt level is not too high. Otherwise your child can't water the plant successfully.

Please bring your child's plant with a drainage dish.
